INTRODUCING OUR JUDGES



BARBARA RAY (TICA USA)

Barbara has always had the greatest love for cats! As a child and teenager Barbara and her grandmother did cat rescue - any needy or abandoned cat or kitten or litter of kittens. At that time Barbara had never dreamed of owning a purebred cat. They adopted a Maine Coon Cat from a family that had to give it up because of allergies. At that time Barbara didn't know anything about the Maine Coon Cat breed, but the beauty and grace this cat possessed stole her heart and she knew there would always be a Maine Coon in her life. She found the cat to have exquisite looks, she was friendly, smart, and acted more like a dog than a cat. This Maine Coon cat lived 17 1/2 years and gave Barbara so much pleasure. After living with this divine creature for a time Barbara decided that when she was through college, settled, and was able; she would breed these cats and bring this wonderful, and at the time not very well known breed, to people who loved and wanted big, special cats. Ten years later her dream came true. Barbara purchased her first Maine Coon female and began going to cat shows. It was hard going at the beginning - trying to get that first association to take the breed seriously, but in 1982 someone said to her, "You ought to find a TICA Show - TICA recognizes minority breeds (and Maine Coons were very much a minority breed at that time) AND you will have a good time at the show!" Well, Barbara did find that TICA show in Atlanta, Georgia, and the rest is history. Barbara bred her first TICA Top Twenty International Winner in 1983 and enjoyed exhibiting in TICA all over the US and Europe. By 2006 the number of TICA Top Twenty International Winners for Willowplace Cattery was 54. Barbara placed the first breeding pair of Maine Coons that were shown in Japan in 1988. Upon the request of Aline and Philippe Noel (then Regional Directors of TICA Europe) Barbara took show quality Maine Coons to Europe in 1989 for breeders that the Noel's recommended. For the judging program, Barbara also worked with Siamese (her boy she Supremed in TICA lived 15 years), Persian, Manx, Sphynx, and American Shorthair. Bengals were in TICA's New Breed and Color Category when Barbara began training to become a TICA judge in 1989. She has so enjoyed watching over the years the Bengal Breed become some of the best cats in almost every TICA show. Some of the best experiences of her life have been made possible with exhibiting, working with breeders and judging all over the world.



DEBORAH CAMERON (CATS NSW)

I feel like a kindred spirit with cats. They are so unique, small and large, domestic or wild but each with its own personality. I was introduced to the cat fancy by my mum who bred Persians and after becoming a Steward at 16, moved forward after some years breeding and showing Persians of the Chinchilla/Shaded, Golden, Smokes, Bi-colours and Pointed variety. My daughter, Jess, is now also involved but she chose the bounce of the Singapura, showing and breeding for a short time and now lives happily with them following her from room to room. I have held a number of positions in different Clubs, served on the NSW Governing body in an Executive role, run consultations with the cat fancy and supported campaigns around the cat fancy and responsible cat ownership and related regulations or potential changes in legislation. I am an All-breeds Judge and Tutor Judge and have enjoyed my time within Australia and abroad- leaving from Sydney airport until the new airport is built in southwestern Sydney. Working fulltime as a Business Development Manager in Allied Health, I enjoy spending time with the many friends I have made in my workplace, in the Cat Fancy and of course judging. I love the time spent with each exhibit that all have something different to offer, and enjoy chatting with exhibitors whether they are knowledgeable about their breed or new to the cat fancy.



HAZEL ROSSITER (CATS NSW)

Since my childhood I have had animals in my life and it was inevitable that I would be involved with them as an adult. I have owned and successfully shown Labrador Retrievers in the U.K. In the early eighties I left the Channel Islands and emigrated to Australia with my family and my two Labradors. After thoroughly enjoying showing my dogs in the UK I then decided to look at the various cat breeds. I purchased two Siamese cats as pets in 1986 and this was invariably my introduction to the Cat Fancy. I have bred and shown Burmese, Siamese, and Oriental Shorthairs and have had considerable success under the "Ahzel" prefix. I have also owned a Devon Rex and our household currently includes a Scottish Fold plus British Shorthairs which I currently show. Not to forget our domestics which I have rescued and welcomed into our home, whilst they do not have a pedigree there is a place for them at shows and I take great pleasure in judging them and giving them awards. I have been actively involved in numerous clubs and have held various positions of Secretary of the Burmese Cat Society of A/Asia and President of the Oriental Cat Club of NSW. I gained my group 3 judges licence with NSW CFA in 1999 and became an all shorthair judge in 2004. Having moved to ANCATS in 2006 I attained my group 1.



JENNY WEEKES (CATS NSW)

I purchased my first pet Birman in 1990 and my first breeding Birman in 1994. With my husband Greg we have bred Birmans in Canberra, Townsville, Wellington (NZ) on the Gold Coast and now at Murrumbateman. My first prefix - Kachin was granted in Canberra in 1994 and my current prefix, Sunsoar, was granted in 1997. We have achieved many major awards at specialist and All Breed shows including Birman Cat Fanciers Qld Supreme Exhibit 2010 and 2012 and two Best Group 1 desexed at the ACF National 2016. Following my retirement from the RAAF and moving to the Gold Coast in 2006, I was able to commence training to become a judge with QFA and gained my Companion licence in 2007 with QFA, followed by a Group 1 (Longhair) licence in 2009. I became an All Breeds Judge in 2014. Greg and I are enjoying our life in Murrumbateman and share our home with our Birmans, Bees and Alpacas. Aside from my cat related activities I enjoy gardening, bee keeping, travelling and spending time with the grandchildren.



ALISON MOORE (CATS NSW)

I have always been surrounded by animals, with cats first entering my life at age 16 when a beautiful young cat gave birth to 5 kittens in a sack of concrete in my father's shed. Two of those kittens stayed with our family, and having moved to the ACT some years later, I was again keen for feline company. I purchased a blue point Birman as a pet in 1992 and my journey in the Cat Fancy began. Having tasted success in the household pet section of local shows, I obtained a chocolate point female Birman and joined the Majik prefix in 1993. I have bred Birmans exclusively since that time, establishing the Birali prefix in 2002 and enjoyed success in the show ring, featuring in many Cat of the Year awards. I have held various Committee positions on the Birman Cat Club of Canberra for many years, and participated in all aspects of Managing and running cat shows for over 25 years, including the Royal Canberra Show. I qualified as a Steward in 1993 and have had the pleasure of being invited to steward at several National Shows and the Sydney Easter Royal Show. I undertook the role of Chief Steward at the ACF National Show in Sydney in 2018. I joined Cats NSW in 2014 and am now seeking to qualify as a judge, starting with Group 1.




SOPHIA BIRD (NSW CFA)

We also started breeding Burmese around the same time under the prefix 'Misara'. I really enjoyed showing our cats and wanted to be more involved in the cat fancy, and when I thought I was ready and the judging course was offered I jumped at it. In my day to day life I am a theatre nurse at a major teaching hospital in Sydney. DEBBIE THOMAS (CATS NSW)

I have been involved with the Cat Fancy for over 15 years and my first exhibits were companion cats. I love all breeds of cats but have particular interest in the beautiful Somali. I have bred both Somalis and Abyssinians under the Nareira prefix and have had success on the show bench with both of these breeds although I am now concentrating on the Somalis. I am an accredited steward and have worked at shows in various capacities. I am also an active member of 3 cat clubs and hold Executive positions. I began as a companion judge in 2003 with the NSW CFA and I now look forward to new assignments with Cats NSW judging their beautiful cats and kittens.



TRACEY CAMP (NSW CFA)

I commenced my Norwegian Forest Cat Journey in 1997 and started my breeding program in 2000 under the prefix Bushkenheim. I migrated to Australia in 2006 bringing 6 Foundation cats with me. I now actively show under NSW CFA. I became a Group 1 Probationary judge in 2021. I have served on the NSW CFA Management committee since 2016. I became the treasurer in 2019 and became the President in 2022. I am dedicated in ensuring the NSW CFA is sustainable and is the leading cat body in NSW. Currently I am a Group 1 and a Companion Cat Judge. More importantly I am passionate about the cat fancy having a love of everything feline!!



DAVID COLLEY (NZCF)

I have been involved in NZCF since 1998, when we purchased our first Pedigree kitten, a Cornish Rex Kitten which we showed in 1999. By 2000 we went to Sydney and purchased some Cornish Rex cats from Eula Cross and started Breeding them which we really enjoyed. They are real fun and so active. We then started breeding Russian Blues in 2006, with again buying breeding stock from Australia. These are such loving and loyal cats, with a fantastic nature. We still breed Russians and we have just recently gone back into breeding the Cornish Rex our first litter due within a month. During 2003 - 2005 I trained as a Shorthaired Cat judge, and since then have judged throughout NZ, which is a real honour and twice in Australia, both times for ACF at their National Shows - 2017 in Brisbane and 2023 in Launceston. I have spent 2 - 3 year terms on the Executive Council and 2 years as Chairperson before not standing again for re-election last April. I will be coming from NZ but I am from Australia, having moved to NZ when I was only 19 years old.



TROY WILLEMS (FCCV)

In 2005, my life took an exciting turn when I stumbled upon an article about Bengal cats. The concept of these domesticated hybrids with Asian Leopard Cat lineage instantly captivated me. Following extensive research, I knew I had to introduce these magnificent felines into my life. In early 2006, I joined the FCCV as a breeder, operating under the Voodoocat prefix, and soon acquired my first breeding pair. Alongside my involvement as a breeder and exhibitor, I delved into the world of cat stewardship with the FCCV, where I had the privilege of working with esteemed domestic and international judges. An exciting opportunity to undertake the Group 2 & 3 judge's courses presented itself, and I eagerly embraced the challenge. I successfully obtained my open judging license for Groups 2 & 3 in January 2017, and I relish the opportunity to evaluate short-haired cats at events nationwide. During 2023 I took my judging knowledge to the next level to become an all breeds judge and successfully completed my Group 1 judging licence requirements.



TONY HURRY (CATS NSW)

Our feline friends have been a part of my life since early childhood. Even an asthmatic allergy to cat hair could not lessen my love, devotion and involvement with cats. Aged 13, I was granted my Breeder's Prefix, Kalinya thereby entering me in to the pleasures and heartaches of breeding and showing Siamese. During my teenage years as a junior member of Illawarra Pedigree Cat Fancy I worked as a Steward and wherever else I could be of assistance. My breeding and showing life was interrupted for a longer than expected period by my human breeding programme. Resurrecting my Kalinya prefix in 1990, I resumed feline breeding with firstly a "rescued" lilac Burmese then British Shorthair and since 1991, my first love, Siamese. By gaining my Judge's Licence for Group 2 (2003) and Group 1 (2007), I have given myself the opportunity to share my knowledge and training with exhibitors and to continue the responsible ownership and breeding of cats.

All Kittens entered that are under the age of 4 months will be automatically entered into Baby Kitten Class, "free of charge", unless otherwise requested on entry form.

ALL CATS must be entered in the Open Class. ALL KITTENS must be entered in an AGE CLASS. LITTER CLASS does not count, as a class for Litter Kittens entered individually.

To be eligible to be judged as a litter, at least one (1) kitten from the litter must be registered and entered in their age class

CRYSTAL EXHIBIT

This is a Special Class for the Kitten or Cat that you feel is an ideal representative of the Breed and an admirable ambassador for the Breed. Special Crystal Trophy will be awarded to the Overall Crystal Exhibit and Rosette. Each Group winner will receive a Rosette

CHALLENGE, RESERVE CHALLENGE and BEST IN SECTION awards will be awarded subject to the exhibit reaching the standard required by the Judge.

DONATIONS TO TROPHY FUND: All donations will be gratefully accepted and received with thanks and will be acknowledged in the Show Catalogue.

TROPHIES, CARDS AND RIBBONS: Exhibitors are reminded that all trophies, ribbons and cards left on cages are the responsibility of the exhibitor and will not be replaced should they go missing.

CANCELLATIONS: **Please phone the Show Secretary (Mrs Julie Fitzhenry), 0412 044 728 by 20th JUNE 2024**

RECEIPT OF ENTRY: Please include a stamped addressed envelope with your entry if sending by post.

SHOW CLOSURE: The Club requires that cats remain on exhibition until 4.00pm. Any Exhibitor or person wishing to take an exhibit from the Show Hall prior to this time *MUST* write, requesting permission, seven (7) days before the show date and on show day *MUST BE* escorted from the hall by the Show Manager, Show Secretary or Show Official. Permission *WILL NOT* be given on the day of the show.

INTERSTATE EXHIBITORS: Please note that the 5-day rule applies for this show. For interstate exhibits, please forward a copy of pedigree with entry.

CAGES:

At this show, exhibitors must provide the dimensions of these cages with their entry. Please state clearly the dimensions (width, depth, height) of cages. **Maximum allowable dimensions shall be 76cm wide x 53cm deep x 61c high (30" x 21" x 24")**. The cage must be either all metal, wire construction or sturdy cardboard on 3 sides with wire door or top, corflute around the sides of cages. Otherwise, all hire cages will be the club's own marine ply (white) cages – Double 27", Single 18".

SHOW CURTAINS AND BASE, LITTER TRAYS, AND WATER BOWLS

White or coloured fabric curtains and a base are permitted.

Curtains with lace or gauze frills are not permitted during judging.

Igloo type bases are not permitted during judging. Donut type bases are permitted.

Pillow slip base covers shall be sealed at the ends so that a cat cannot get inside the cover.

Any coloured plastic litter tray is permitted in cages during judging.

Any colour plastic or stainless-steel clip-on water bowls attached to the front or door of the cage are permitted.

PROHIBITED SUBSTANCES:

Methylated spirits, bleach, atomisers and aerosol sprays are not permitted in the show hall. Dettol and similar coal tar derivatives are not to be used as disinfectants. Talcum powder or any similar substance may not be applied to or brushed from an exhibit while in vicinity of the cages in the show hall.

ALL EXHIBITS MUST BE REGISTERED WITH CCCA, ACF OR ANCATS

NB: IT IS A CONDITION OF ENTRY THAT ALL EXHIBITS WILL REMAIN ON EXHIBITION IN THE HALL UNTIL CLOSE OF SHOW AT 4.00 P.M. UNLESS A PREVIOUS REQUEST HAS BEEN MADE IN WRITING TO THE SHOW MANAGER / SHOW SECRETARY NO LATER THAN SEVEN (7) DAYS PRIOR TO THE SHOW.

EXHIBITOR'S CHECK LIST:

Don't forget to clip both front and back claws of all Kittens.

Don't FORGET to COMPLETE YOUR VETTING SLIP (except for Cage No) AND RETURN WITH ENTRIES

Don't FORGET to attach a copy of your Exhibit's Registration Certificate to your entry

NB: DO NOT FORGET to bring YOUR VACINATION CERTIFICATE OR A COPY for KITTEN and CAT AS NO EXHIBIT WILL BE ADMITTED without the original or a copy duly signed by a qualified Veterinary Surgeon.

NSW CAT FANCIERS' ASSOCIATION INC

EXHIBITOR INFORMATION - SPECIAL EXHIBITOR AND ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

MEMBERSHIP STATUS: All exhibitors resident in NSW must be current financial members of NSWCFCA, except when the show is an Open Entry show where Cats NSW and ANCATS members may exhibit. New exhibitors resident in NSW may show three times as non-members provided their exhibits are registered in their name with NSWCFCA. An exhibitor resident in another state must be a member of a controlling body recognised by CCCA or ACF and the exhibits must be registered in the exhibitor's name with that controlling body.

ENTRIES: All entries must be submitted on the - www.catsonline.com - portal, together with a clear copy of each exhibit's registration certificate in the name of the exhibitor as owner plus vaccination record. For interstate exhibitors where the registration certificate does not include a four generation pedigree, then a four generation pedigree must be provided showing the breeds and colours of all forebears. All exhibits must conform to CCCA Breed Standards.

COMPLAINTS AND DISPUTES: Show Procedure 1.3 requires that any dispute arising from any aspect of the conduct of a show shall be referred to the Show Committee of the show prior to the conclusion of the show.

AMENDMENTS TO SEX/COLOUR/TITLES: Any change to the sex or colour/pattern or the title of an exhibit after an entry has been lodged must be submitted in writing to the Show Secretary together with a copy of the amended Certificate of Registration no later than one week prior to the show date unless arrangements have been made with the Show Secretary to provide the changes at a later date.

CLAWS TO BE CLIPPED: The front and back claws of each exhibit must be clipped. Judges may class an exhibit as Not in Show Condition (NSC) when the claws are not adequately clipped.

VETERINARY INSPECTION: Each exhibit must be inspected by and pass the Veterinary Officer's Inspection – REFER Point 13 – In Line Vetting.

VACCINATION OF KITTENS: All kittens must be vaccinated and at least one vaccination must be administered by a qualified veterinary practitioner. Exhibitors must produce documentary evidence (valid vaccination certificate signed by a qualified vet) for each kitten, and a vaccination shall have been carried out not less than 14 days prior to the date of the show. Failure to produce a valid vaccination certificate at vetting may result in a single vet out for the kitten concerned. (See also Show Procedure 6.3 c).

VACCINATION OF CATS: Clause 6.3 of NSWCFCA Show Procedures relating to vaccination requirements for exhibits over 9 months has been updated. All cats (ie exhibits 9 months and over) must have had a Feline 3 vaccination administered within a period of not more than 3 years prior to the date of the show. This is a minimum requirement. Exhibitors must produce documentary evidence (valid vaccination certificate signed by a qualified vet) for each cat.

AGGRESSIVE EXHIBITS: A Judge or Steward is not required to handle any exhibit showing signs of aggression. Owners have a duty of care not to bench any exhibit that has a reported history of fractious behaviour. The Show Manager in consultation with the Show Representative may request the removal of any such exhibit from the show.

NSWCFCA CAT/KITTEN OF THE YEAR AWARDS: To be eligible for Cat of the Year award a cat must be in the continuous ownership of a NSWCFCA financial member throughout the year. Points are awarded based on the Top Five results at a show – 1st - 10pts; 2nd – 7pts; 3rd - 4pts; 4th – 2pts; 5th – 1pt.

Note 1. Where an owner becomes a member after the start of a calendar year, points will only accumulate from the date the membership application is processed by the NSW CFA Office.

Note 2. If during the year a cat is transferred to a new owner who is not a member, the cat's ownership by a financial member will be deemed continuous provided a membership application from the new owner is received and recorded by the NSWCFCA Office within 4 weeks of the date of transfer, otherwise note 1 shall apply.

Note 3. Where an interstate, Cats NSW, or ANCATS exhibit gains a Top Five placing, then that placing remains awarded to that exhibit and the placing of NSW CFA exhibits is not altered.

SHOW PROCEDURES – ATTACHMENT E

JUNIOR EXHIBITOR

- The aim of this class is to encourage Junior Exhibitors, whether they own a pedigree or domestic, to bench their cat and look after it at the show.
- A Junior Exhibitor must be under the age of 18 years at the beginning of the calendar/show year.
- There are to be two age divisions - 6 to 12 years & 13 to 17 years.
- Under no circumstance is a child in the 6 to 12 years category to be asked to handle their exhibit for judgement due to insurance restrictions.
- It is required that the parent/guardian accompany their child during the assessment at a discrete distance.
- Assessment to be based on
 - General knowledge of their exhibit.
 - How it was prepared prior to the show ie grooming.
 - Knowledge of their chosen breed if a pedigree cat.
 - General care, cat husbandry, exhibition cage preparation.
 - Cat presentation and cleanliness
 - Exhibits temperament
 - 13 to 17 yrs to handle and present their exhibit.
- The Junior Exhibitor must be either a financial Junior Member OR part of a Family Membership.
- A Junior Exhibitor does not have to own the cat which he/she exhibits and does not have to exhibit the same cat throughout the whole year.
- No charge is made for entering the Junior Exhibitor class.
- All Junior Exhibitors' cats must be entered in their normal open or age class.
- Junior Exhibitors are to be issued with their own vet slip which must be endorsed Junior Exhibitor. They must attend the show, take the cat through vetting, and bench their cat.
- All Junior Exhibitors' cats will be judged together irrespective of whether the cat is a pedigreed or not.
- First, second and third places will carry points which are awarded to the Junior Exhibitor, and the points will accumulate during the year.
- The judge judging the challenge classes need not judge this class. However the challenge classes must be judged first.

NOTES: 1) Junior Exhibitor is not a compulsory miscellaneous class.

2) NSW CFA will provide a form to be filled in at any participating show. The completed form is to be sent to the CFA office for the end of year tally.

3) Be it one show or 10, the Junior Exhibitor with the most points will be awarded the years' Junior Exhibitor award.

This may be reviewed if popularity increases.
